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**RESOLUTION NO. R-05-14**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLTON TO APPROVE STAFF RECOMMENDED CHANGES TO THE CUSTOMER SERVICE POLICY, GENERAL PROVISIONS, SECTION III, ELECTRIC VEHICLE DISCOUNT**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Colton is a general law city, duly organized and existing under the laws of the State of California, and situated in the County of San Bernardino; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of Colton has the jurisdiction over the implementation of rules and rates for the Electric Utility as propounded in the Customer Service Policy; and

**WHEREAS**, the Electric Utility has proposed changes to the Customer Service Policy, General Provisions, Section III, Electric Vehicle Discount to update and re-instate the EV Discount program for residential customers who own and operate EVs and to encourage the purchase and use of EVs in the City of Colton; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council must approve any changes in the Customer Services Policy prior to the implementation of any proposed changes.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Colton City Council finds that it would be appropriate to adopt the changes to the Customer Service Policy, General Provisions, Section III Electric Vehicle Discount proposed in Exhibit "A" attached and made a part hereof to become effective on February 1, 2014. All previous resolutions amending, modifying or otherwise changing the General Provision, Section II Electric Vehicle Discount are hereby superseded.

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**EXHIBIT "A"**

GENERAL PROVISIONS

I. The following rules are effective within the City of Colton as approved by the City Council.

The Utility's Rules for supplying electric service, Rate Schedules, and various instructions may be revised, amended, superseded, or otherwise changed from time to time by the City Counsel. Copies of the rules in effect will be kept up-to-date and on file in the office of the City Clerk. Customers or others contemplating any expenditures or activities governed by these rules should assure themselves that they have the latest correct information by visiting, telephoning or otherwise contacting the Utility.

II. POWER COST ADJUSTMENT

The Power Cost Adjustment (PCA) is a change per kWh which is used (1) to adjust the Utility's electric rates for the actual cost of purchasing and generating electric power and energy to service the City's Customers, and (2) to minimize the fluctuation in rates.

The rates in each rate schedule include 5.4081 cents per kWh (hereinafter called the Basic Power Cost Component) to recover the costs of purchasing and delivering power and energy from all suppliers of power and energy, other supplies, and the cost of power and energy from the Utility's own generating resources.

The PCA will reflect all changes in power and energy costs including the following:

- Changes in the wholesale Fuel Cost Adjustment Billing Factor.
- Changes in any component of the wholesale rate.
- Changes in transmission and wheeling payments.
- Changes in scheduling and dispatching payments
- Changes in Replacement Energy (SCE).
- Changes in contract incremental costs.
- Changes in economy energy purchases.
- Changes in take-or-pay obligations.
- Changes in the Power Sales Agreement (SCE).

The PCA which is set forth below shall be applied to kWh sold on and after the effective date, as also set forth below, and continue thereafter until a new PCA becomes effective. The amount to be added to or subtracted from each bill due to the PCA shall be calculated by multiplying the number of kWh for which the bill is rendered by the applicable PCA. The Utility shall develop and periodically adjust the PCA in accordance with the City Resolution No. 4502 so as to keep the balancing account within the limits of \$900,000 over-collection and -\$100,000 under-collection.

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III. ELECTRIC VEHICLE DISCOUNT

This rate will be available to customers served on Rate Schedule R-1 (Residential Rate).

To be eligible for this rate discount, the Customer must provide a copy of the annual registration for the eligible electric vehicle (EV). Only Customers who charge California DMV registered, roadworthy vehicles at a location served by the Utility are eligible.

Participating customers will receive discounts an additional 250 kWh in their Tier 2 consumption allowance for electricity. This will allow the customer to be billed at the Tier 2 \$ per kWh rate for consumption between 251 and 750 kWh per month. The current tier/rate structure for residential customers is as follows:

Tier 1	Up to 250 kWh per month	\$0.08000
Tier 2	251 to 500 kWh per month	\$0.19305
Tier 3	501 to 1,500 kWh per month	\$0.22770
Tier 4	1,501 kWh and above per month	\$0.29205

Based on the current rate/tier structure shown above, the following tier/rate structure would apply to a qualified EV customer:

Tier 1	Up to 250 kWh per month	\$0.08000
Tier 2	251 to 750 kWh per month	\$0.19305
Tier 3	751 to 1,500 kWh per month	\$0.22770
Tier 4	1,501 kWh and above per month	\$0.29205

The EV Discount is an adjustment to the consumption allowance for Tier 2 of the rate structure. The customer will be charged the current per kWh costs for consumption while they are participating in this program.
